Historical/Other Items of Interest

- A&B began as a sugar-growing partnership, formed on Maui in 1870, between Samuel T. Alexander and Henry P. Baldwin. The company was incorporated in Honolulu in 1900.
- On October 1, 2008, A&B began trading its shares on the New York Stock Exchange, ninety-five years to the day it began trading as a public company on the Honolulu Stock and Bond Exchange. Prior, the Company was listed on the Nasdaq Stock Market.
- A&B's Matson Navigation Company subsidiary is the major intermodal ocean freight carrier between the U.S. West Coast and Hawaii, with six arrivals in Hawaii from the West Coast every 14 days.
- In early 2006, Matson launched its Hawaii/Guam/China service, which employs five containerships in a weekly service that carries cargo from the U.S. Pacific Coast to Honolulu, then to Guam. The vessels continue to China, where they are loaded with cargo to be discharged in Long Beach, CA.
- A&B is the fourth-largest private landowner in Hawaii, with over 88,000 acres, including over 68,000 acres on Maui and 20,000 acres on Kauai. Real estate subsidiary A&B Properties, Inc. leases 7.9 million square feet of improved property.
- A&B's HC&S plantation on Maui is the largest producer of raw sugar in Hawaii, producing 171,800 tons of sugar in 2010.
- In the last two decades alone, A&B and its charitable foundation (the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation) donated \$33 million to non-profit organizations, primarily in Hawaii and on the West Coast, contributing to a better quality of life in the communities in which A&B operates.
