The year 2002 dawned with Hawaii and our nation facing economic crisis.

Uncertainty veiled our everyday world and the impact was felt in Alexander & Baldwin's communities, as residents faced unexpected losses of jobs and income.

Strengthened by a heritage of charitable support for our communities, the leaders of the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation approached this challenge in an extraordinary way: rather than decrease grant making resources, commensurate with decreased funding company earnings, the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation *added* a quarter of a million dollars to its giving.

With respect for our host culture, a Hawaiian word was selected to identify this special fund: ***Manawale'a***, which the *Hawaiian Dictionary* by Pukui and Elbert defines as 'a generous heart; to give freely and willingly.' These additional monies were targeted to preventing homelessness and hunger in our key communities.

And this was accomplished, thanks to the dedicated efforts of the employees of Alexander & Baldwin, Inc. and its many subsidiaries—who persevered through a difficult 2002 to enable the A&B Foundation to have the resources to provide the increased support the community needed—and the many charitable agencies in our communities whose leadership, staff, and volunteers worked overtime to meet the challenges.

In 2002, nearly \$1.573 million was donated to 458 charities by the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation in Hawaii and in key communities of the U.S. Mainland. A sampling of the stories behind these impressive figures is within this *2002 Review of Giving*.

We hope you will take a few minutes to review it, to see for yourself the expressions of our generous hearts.

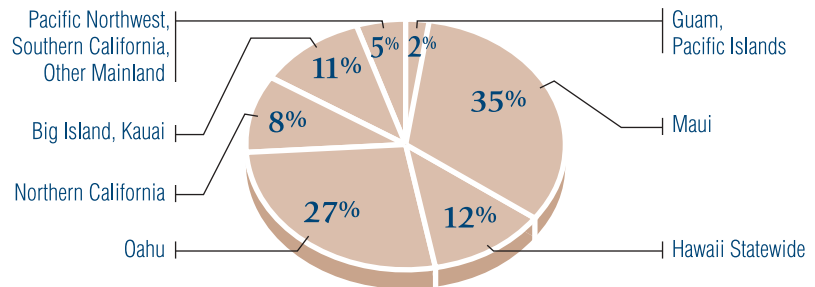
A CLOSER LOOK AT OUR HEART

In 2002, 259 organizations in Hawaii and the Pacific, and 67 organizations on the U.S. Mainland received \$1.573 million in total from the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation; this figure includes nearly \$90,000 provided to 132 additional schools and charities, matching gifts made by individual employees via a matching gifts program. It also includes a quarter of a million dollars of emergency support for eight special charities serving the critical needs of Hawaii residents in the wake of economic strife—our Manawale’a program.

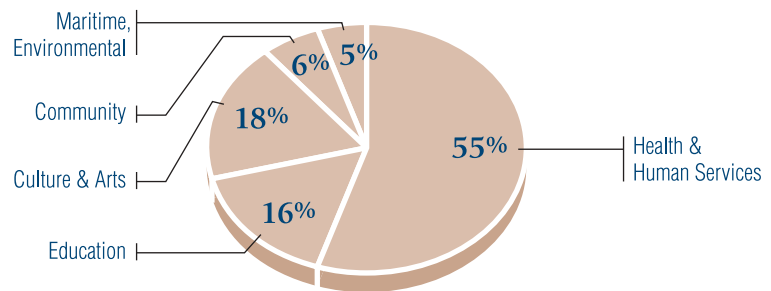
Building strong communities is what the A&B Foundation is all about—and has been, for well over a century. Giving freely, with a generous heart, has helped to provide the resources our communities need both routinely and urgently. Because the operations of our funding companies span many geographic locations, and to preserve our ability to respond to our communities’ changing needs, the causes supported by the A&B Foundation vary widely—in location, size and purpose. Recipient organizations could be neighborhood-focused, targeted to a single town or island, or impacting an entire state. Grants could range from \$100 to \$180,000 and be for start-up funding or major capital support. The common denominator? Each organization is effective at improving the quality of life for the residents in our key communities.

The charts and graphs, and the lists of individual grants in this *Review of Giving*, provide a closer look at our decisions—made with our hearts as well as our heads. Look closely and you’ll see the A&B Foundation is a reflection of a long tradition of investing in the community’s social fabric, which means giving freely and willingly to the communities in which Alexander & Baldwin employees live and work.

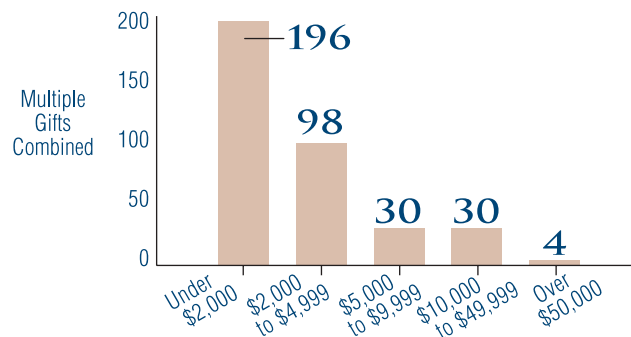
BY GEOGRAPHIC AREA

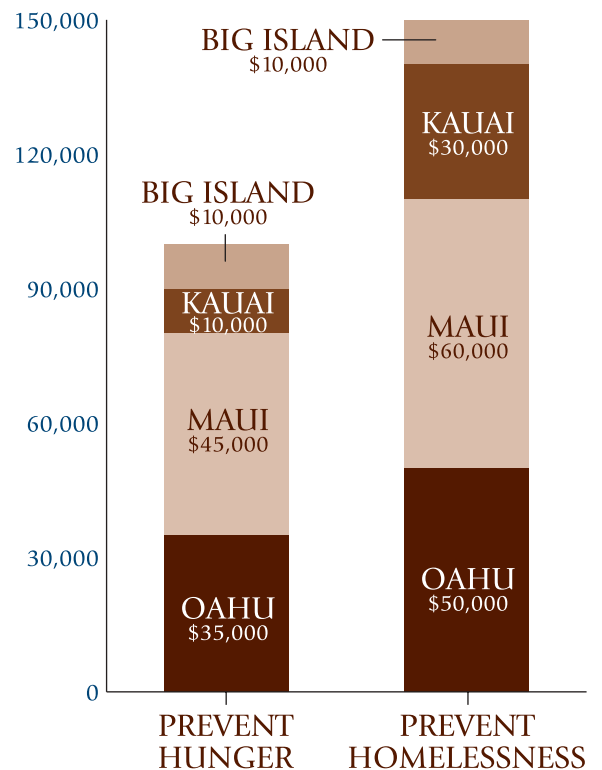
MANAWALE‘A

a generous heart

The Alexander & Baldwin Foundation usually serves as a community resource, responsive to requests received from charities in key communities. Following the economic fallout from the 2001 terrorist attacks, and with the support of our funding corporation, we took a proactive approach. An additional \$250,000 was allocated statewide through a program named Manawale‘a, which, in Hawaiian, means ‘a generous heart; to give freely and willingly’. The separate identity was established to distinguish this one-time support from our ongoing, broad-based giving, which continued as well.

Our emergency support was directed to what were, very quickly, the most obvious, basic needs—food and shelter—to prevent hunger and homelessness resulting from a short-term interruption in income. To address these needs, \$100,000 was granted to four food banks and \$150,000 was granted to four agencies distributing rental and mortgage assistance funds in each county. Estimates are that our funds helped more than one hundred and fifty families—or as many as 800 persons—maintain their homes; food banks estimate that our support translated into one million meals for Hawaii’s hungry families.

In addition to member service agencies, the Hawaii Island Food Bank provides food for emergency food pantries and delivers meals to low-income senior citizens.

UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT HILO

The University of Hawaii at Hilo continues to grow, in part by improving its recruitment of college-bound Hawaii high school students. Receptions on neighbor islands enable students and their parents to meet faculty and staff to discover that UH Hilo has bachelor's degree programs in Nursing, Agriculture, Forestry & Natural Resource Management and offers master's degrees in Hawaiian Studies and Education. A \$5,000 grant helped fund this outreach.



IOLANI SCHOOL

Iolani School has been involved in a capital fund raising effort that supports a new athletic stadium, a multipurpose building and a new classroom building with space for 36 classrooms and 4 AP Biology and Chemistry Labs. 360 new parking spaces will be housed in the multipurpose building and an assembly room with a seating capacity of 800 will be on the first floor of the new classroom building. A \$25,000 grant helped fund this capital improvement project.

MID-PACIFIC INSTITUTE

The A&B Foundation contributed \$10,000 this year, bringing to \$25,000 its support for the new math, science and technology complex currently under construction at Mid-Pacific Institute; this facility will position MPI as one of the leading math/science/technology high schools in the United States. The three buildings will include math and science classrooms and a 12,000 square-foot technology learning center with state-of-the-art equipment and software.



K.I.D.S. SCHOOL

K.I.D.S. School, a private non-profit pre-school on Kauai serving 72 three- and four-year-olds, gets an annual visit from the Kapaa Fire Department and their vehicles to learn about fire safety. K.I.D.S.' learning program is based on sequentially structured activities that stimulate the left and right hemispheres of the brain. Years of positive results demonstrate the value of their program. Our most recent grant was for \$1,000.

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MAUI MEMORIAL MEDICAL CENTER FOUNDATION

A \$20,000 A&B Foundation grant supported the expansion of the angiography-cardiology unit at Maui Memorial Medical Center—the only hospital serving Maui’s growing population. State-of-the-art equipment will augment their existing equipment, shown here, to provide less-invasive diagnostic and treatment options, on island, for residents and visitors. The fundraising for this equipment was undertaken by the Maui Memorial Medical Center Foundation, a community-based organization.

RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES

The Ronald McDonald House Family Room is designed to support Oahu families who wish to remain with their sick or injured children at Kapiolani Medical Center for Women & Children. Families now have a convenient, private place for short rejuvenating breaks to tend to other family matters. A \$2,500 grant helped to equip the Family Room with a small kitchen, play and rest area, games, laundry facilities and a computer with internet access.



WILCOX MEMORIAL HOSPITAL FOUNDATION

Replacing the ophthalmic laser was a high priority for Wilcox Health this year; it had exceeded its life expectancy and was experiencing mechanical problems. A \$15,000 grant from the A&B Foundation helped to purchase a state-of-the-art combination Argon/Yag ophthalmic laser, maintaining the quality and availability of care on Kauai while meeting new standards. Here, Dr. Timothy Lee uses the new ophthalmic laser on a patient.

AYUDA FOUNDATION

The Ayuda Foundation collects and distributes donated medicine, supplies and equipment throughout the Micronesian Islands which include Guam, Northern Marianas, Kosrae, Yap, Pohnpei, Chuuck, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands. Here, a young boy receives care at a medical clinic, thanks in part to a \$1,000 grant from A&B. Ayuda also provides typhoon disaster relief, working between U.S. humanitarian organizations and with transportation companies to secure food and medical supplies for Micronesia.

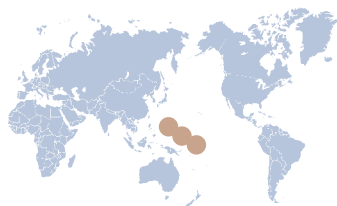

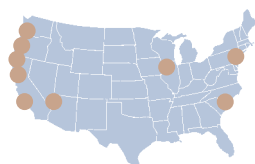

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INSTITUTE FOR HUMAN SERVICES

A \$5,000 start-up grant will help this new program, which serves dual-diagnosed clients, get established. Gregory House also offers social activities, life skills classes, and access to computer and library resources.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY -MAUI

Habitat for Humanity – Maui plans to assist qualified Hawaiian Home Lands recipients with the construction of their homes on Maui, in part with a start-up grant of \$5,000 from A&B. Equal parts of determination, cooperation and “sweat equity” will help these new homeowners’ dreams come true. Last year, volunteers helped clear a lot for the Tejada – Figueroa residence.

HAWAII PUBLIC TELEVISION FOUNDATION

The A&B Foundation's \$10,000 grant will enable PBS Hawaii to complete the federally mandated conversion to digital broadcasting which will offer an entirely new form of programming. Enhanced digital television can be a fusion of video, audio, images and text, meaning that television producers will be able to combine the story-telling power of video and film with the enormous data capacity of a digital television signal.



HAWAII PUBLIC RADIO

Hawaii Public Radio's local "Morning Edition" host Derrick Malama reads local news broadcast to listeners statewide.

Established in 1981 with one FM station, HPR now offers classical, jazz and international music and in-depth news and informational programming on four stations. A \$45,000 multi-year grant will help upgrade their Maui broadcast equipment.

MAUI ARTS & CULTURAL CENTER

Maui Arts & Cultural Center's "CanDo! Days" is a great experience for elementary aged students to see exhibits and performances and also participate themselves in drama, rhythm and movement, and visual arts classes. Children from Hana School take their turn at acting out stories. A&B Foundation has supported this program since its inception with a \$15,000 annual grant.

Also in 2002, the A&B Foundation committed its support to help improve and expand the Maui Arts & Cultural Center's facilities, an appropriate decision for one of the Center's most significant initial capital contributors. The A&B Foundation's pledge of \$100,000 is designated for improvements to the A&B Amphitheatre—specifically, the permanent covering that will shelter the stage and courtyard.

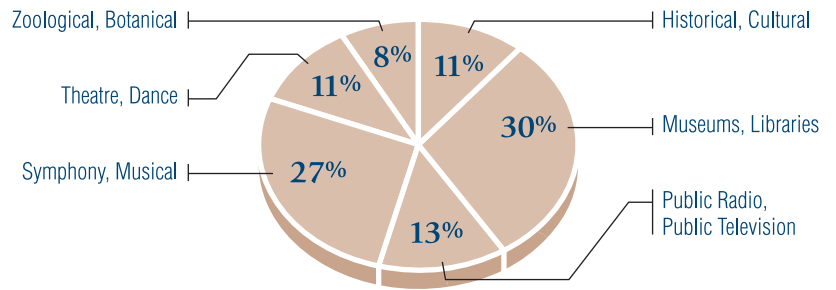

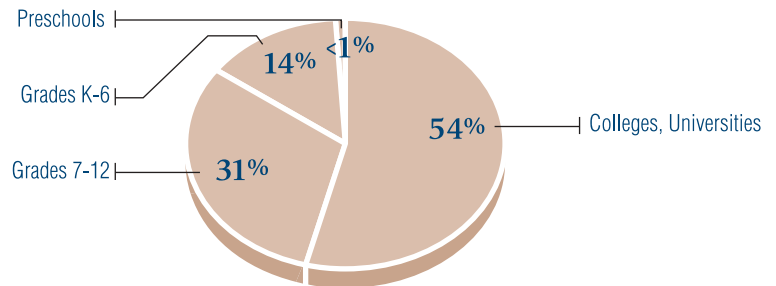

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SAN FRANCISCO MARITIME NATIONAL PARK ASSOCIATION

A Foundation grant of \$12,500 enabled the San Francisco Maritime National Park Association to begin work refitting the historic 1891 scow schooner *Alma* for use in its award-winning living history program, "Age of Sail." The program's curriculum combines a hands-on lesson in San Francisco's rich maritime history with challenging activities specifically designed to foster important life-skills such as cooperation, critical thinking, problem solving, and self-discipline.



GUAM GIRL SCOUTS

To give Guam's girls exposure to careers in math, technology and science, the A&B Foundation supports their project focusing on the traditional practice of Micronesian navigation by the stars that will also include the modern-day methods of computerized, satellite-aided navigation.

The Guam Girl Scouts provide girls with the highest ideals of character, conduct, service and patriotism to guide them to become happy and resourceful citizens. An example of their mission was the visit from a group of 43 young boys and girls from Kobe, Japan who came to Guam for a week-long "adventure trip." The Girl Scouts led activities with the visitors, discovering ways to communicate that dissolved the language barrier.
